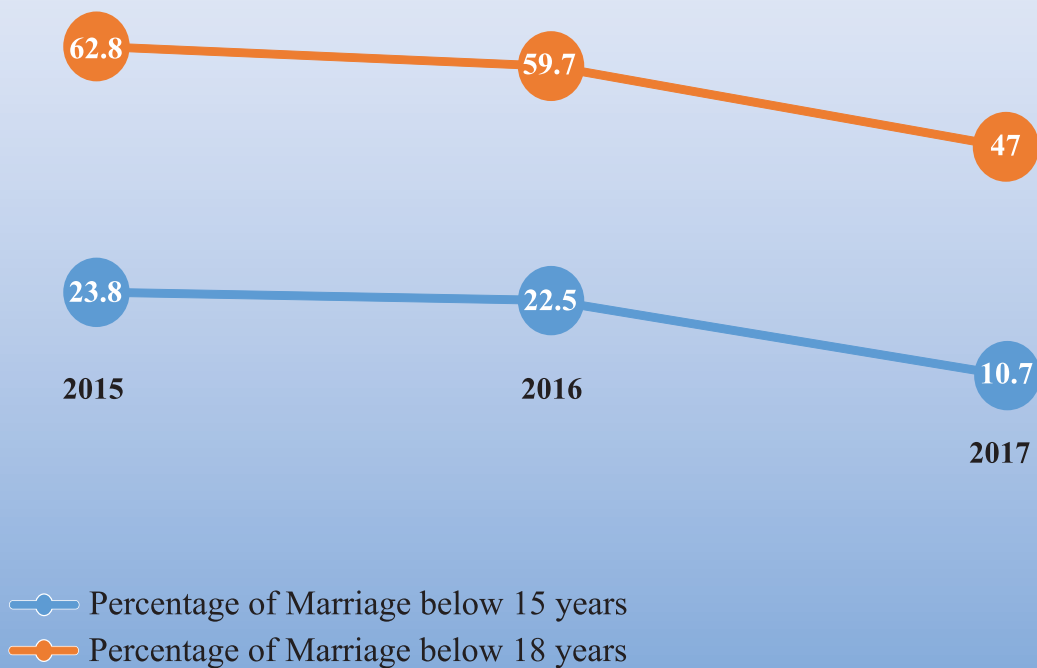




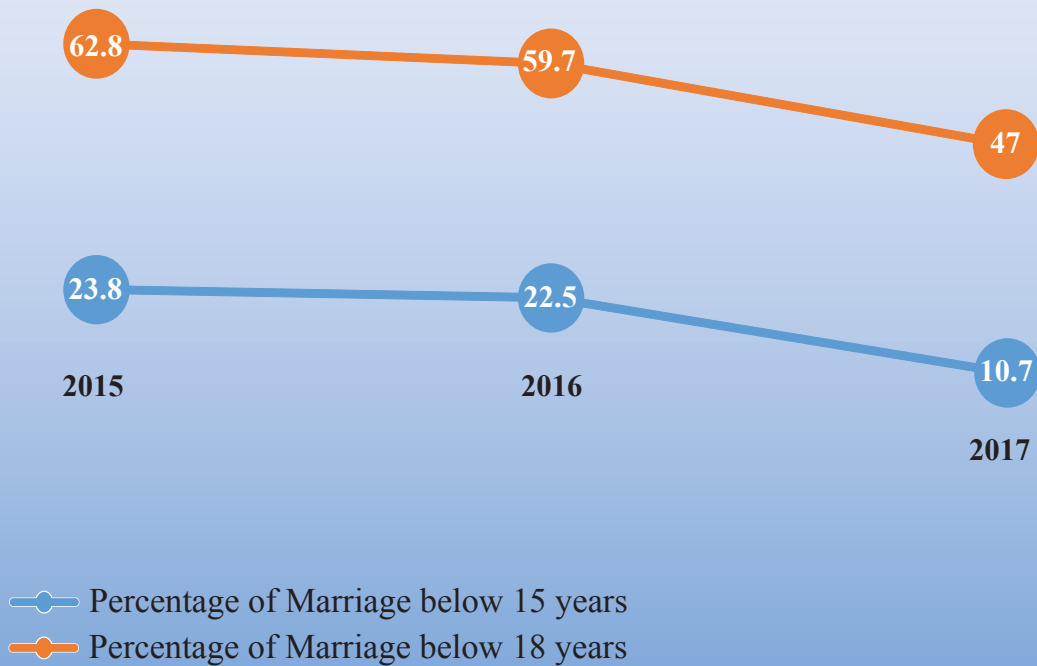

Speech

I am very pleased to know that Ministry of Women and Children Affairs takes initiatives to formulate the National Action Plan to End Child Marriage (2018-2030). On this occasion I would like to congratulate all who are related to this action plan.

The Greatest Bengali of All time, Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman has established equal rights of women in the Constitution of Bangladesh in the year 1972. For the development of women the Awami League Government announced Women Development Policy in the year 1997. We implement major programmes for expansion of education, socio-economic development of women and women's empowerment. Present Government has taken appropriate measures to decrease the rate of child marriage. In Girl's Summit 2014 held in London, we made our commitment to end the child marriage of girls below the age of 15 years and to reduce by one third the rate of marriage for girls aged between 15 and 18 years in 2021 and to completely eliminate child marriage by 2041.

To ensure women and children development in Bangladesh, National Women Development Policy 2011, National Children Policy 2011, Children Act 2013, and Child Marriage Restraint Act 2017 have been formulated. Sustainable Development Goals 2015-2030 set targets for preventing child marriage. To prevent child marriage in grass-roots level we have established 4883 adolescent clubs at union and pourashavas. Women's awareness is being created throughout the country in grass-roots level by information technology under Tottho Apa Project. National Toll Free Helpline Number '109' is playing an important role to prevent child marriage.

Our government has taken different programmes and projects for preventing child marriage and also identifying the reasons of child marriage and to address those problems. The main reasons of child marriage are given and illiteracy. So, to eliminate poverty in grass-roots level, women are given training on different trades for making them economically capable. Several initiatives have been taken to expand women education such as free education for women up to 12th class, stipend, free distribution of education materials and formed education support trust.

A good deal of initiatives of national and local government and non-government organizations help to declare Sylhet division as child marriage free. Actions have already been taken in other divisions. Ministry of Women and Children Affairs and UNICEF jointly launched and disseminated a National Multimedia Campaign for Ending Child Marriage. This campaign has been received Global Award.

I hope that, proper implementation of National Action Plan (2018-2030) will play a significant role in preventing child marriage.

Preface

The London Girl's Summit on 22 July 2014 has given the highest priority to the development of girl child. Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has made commitment in the Summit to end the marriage of girls below the age of 15 years and to reduce by one-third the rate of marriage for girls aged between 15 and 18 years in 2021, and to completely eliminate child marriage by 2041. To implement the commitment of the Hon'ble Prime Minister, Multi-Sectoral Programme on Violence Against Women of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, UNICEF Bangladesh, Plan International Bangladesh organized a series of workshops in divisions, districts and upazila levels. Government officials, NGO representatives, public representatives of local government institutions, students and teachers of educational institutions, journalists from electronic and print media, representatives of religious institutions, marriage registrars, members of citizen's groups participated in the meetings. Based on the recommendations in the workshops, a draft National Action Plan to End Child Marriage was prepared.

To review the draft Action Plan two consultation meetings were held in the conference hall of the Department of Women Affairs on May 6, 2015 and in CIRDAP International Conference Centre on May 17, 2015. Hon'ble Secretary of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs Nasima Begum ndc was the chief guest in these meetings. The representatives of different ministries, departments, organizations, development partners, NGOs and citizen's groups participated in the meetings. The draft Action Plan was updated on the basis of the recommendations of the meetings.

Afterwards, Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, UNICEF Bangladesh and UNFPA jointly organized a workshop in Bangabandhu International Conference Centre (BICC) on 19 July, 2017 to finalize the draft National Action Plan to End Child Marriage. Hon'ble State Minister of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs Meher Afroze Chumki, MP was the chief guest and Hon'ble Secretary of MoWCA Nasima Begum ndc presided over the workshop. Necessary amendments of the Action Plan was made on the basis of the recommendations in the workshop.

The updated Action Plan was uploaded in the website of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs for the public opinion and shared with major NGOs and citizen's groups for their recommendations. The draft Action Plan was modified on the basis of those opinions and recommendations. The Action Plan was shared with different ministries and divisions for their opinion who have been identified as lead agencies and implementing partners of the Action Plan. Based on the recommendations from different ministries the action plan was finalized and approved by the Hon'ble State Minister of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs.

The fiscal year 2018-2019 has been considered as base year in the context of Sustainable Development Goals by United Nations in 2015. All the activities of the Action Plan have been divided into short-term (2018-2019 to 2020-2021 fiscal year), mid-term (2018-2019 to 2024-2025 fiscal year) and long-term (2018-2019 to 2029-2030 fiscal year). The major goal of the Action Plan is to end the marriage of girls below the age of 15 years and to reduce by one-third the rate of marriage for girls aged between 15 and 18 years in 2021, and to completely eliminate child marriage by 2041. There has been five implementation strategies in the Action Plan.

Meanwhile, the prevalence of child marriage has been reduced due to the initiatives of the government and non-government organizations to fulfill the commitment of Hon'ble Prime Minister which has been reflected in the cover page of this action plan. We believe, Bangladesh will be free from child marriage by our coordinated and continuous efforts before the target period.

National Action Plan to End Child Marriage



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1. Introduction:

The child marriage is the violation of fundamental human rights. Because of child marriage, millions of children are being seriously affected. To accelerate the national development goals, protecting girls' rights and women's empowerment are recognized as one of the most important issues all over the world. United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child and SDG 5 have given specific guidelines to restraint child marriage.

Girls marry before the 18th birthday and bear children during adolescence, the harmful consequences which extend the existing barriers for the empowerment of girls and women and the achievement of important national development goals and objectives. The child marriage violates the fundamental human rights¹ of the children and it also obstructs to obtain other rights.

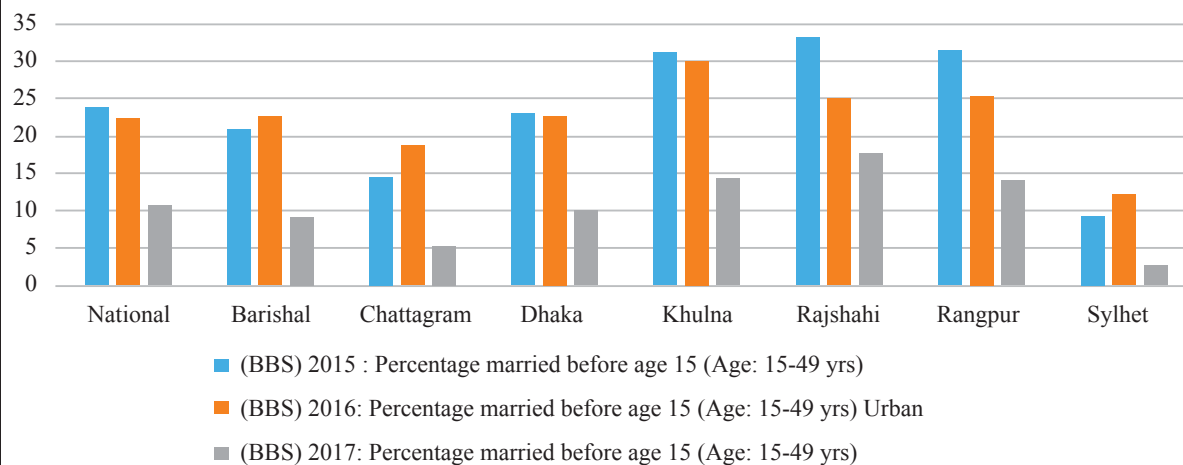
The Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh committed to fulfill all the commitments like the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC), The Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) for empowerment of women, Beijing Declarations and Platform for Action and the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh. Government has already formulated the National Women Development Policy 2011, National Children Policy 2011, Children Act 2013 and Child Marriage Restraint Act 2017 to ensure and protect the child's rights. As per Millennium Development Goal 3, Bangladesh government promotes the rights to access services to ensure the participation of women in the decision-making process. The achievement has been reported in the action plan of CEDAW, Beijing Declarations and Platform for Action.

The London Girl's Summit, a joint initiative of DFID and UNICEF on 22 July 2014 has been given the highest priority to the development of girl children. In the summit, Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina reiterated her commitment to eliminate child marriage. Following the commitment of the Prime Minister, a comprehensive efforts are made to formulate the national action plan.

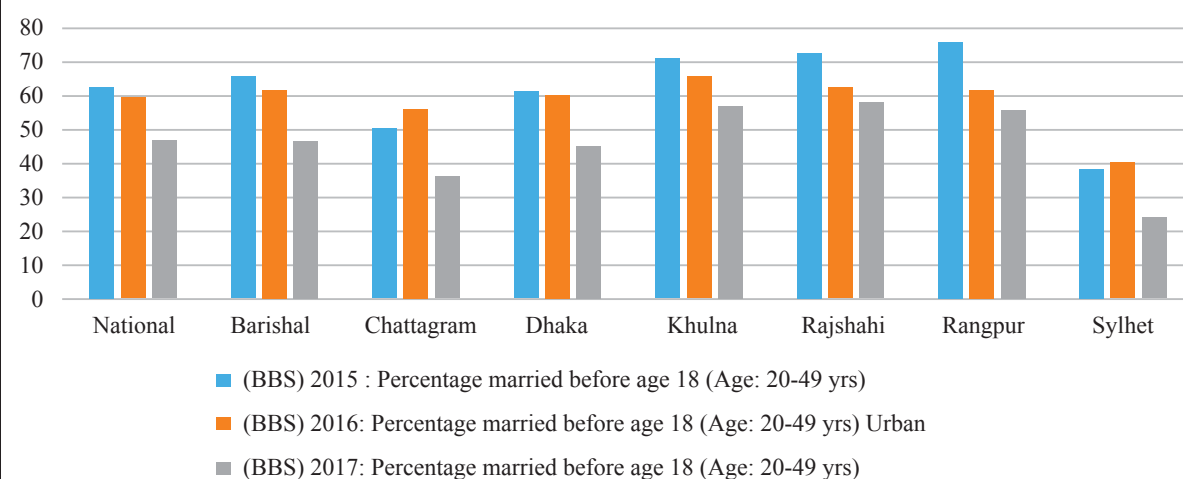
The significant decrease of the prevalence of child marriage due to the different initiatives by the government. The Bangladesh Bureau of Statistics (BBS) conducted a survey in 2015, 2016 and 2017 that shows the declining trends of child marriage in Bangladesh in recent years.

1.1 Definition of Child Marriage

According to section 2.4 of the Child Marriage Restraint Act 2017 (Act 6 of 2017) "child marriage" means a marriage to which either of the contracting parties is a child; section 2.1 reads as "minor" means a person who, if a male, is under twenty-one years of age, and if a female, is under eighteen years of age.

1.2 Causes of Child Marriage

Causes of child marriage in Bangladesh are follows:

- **Patriarchal social system and existing social norms:** Some of the major reasons behind child marriage in Bangladesh are traditional social, cultural, and religious norms and their concomitant social pressure on families and girls. These are key determinants of child marriage in Bangladesh. Girls are often put to marry much earlier than boys. Existing evidence reveals that girls and their families often face a

lot of social pressure from their own families, communities and society to conform with the existing cultural norms and practices. The existing patriarchal values often means that communities consider it to be a social and religious duty for parents to marry off their girls.

- **Poverty and economic insolvency:** In some cases girls in poor families are more vulnerable to child marriage as the parents want to reduce the hardship of poverty by getting them married earlier. The socio-cultural practice of dowry² further influences this situation adversely.
- **Lack of inclusive education:** Government takes different steps to ensure girls education. Besides, some girls faced child marriage in early age due to the distance of educational institution, drop out of girl child at the menstruation for lack of facilities, girls have limited opportunity to involve in vocational training and lack of area-based employment opportunity.
- **Social insecurity and fear of security:** While Bangladeshi women and girls are victimized of sexual harassment and violence, they are not easily accepted in the society as well as an aversion prevalent. Gender based violence is one of the most important reason of child marriage. The rural areas girls often victimize of sexual harassment or repression by adolescent boy or adults on the way to school or class³. Still, many parents of rural areas consider that unmarried adolescent girls are risky to keep at home and family will be dishonored if they face sexual harassment.
- **People's ignorance about the impact of child marriage:** Not only girl child, but also society and state are equally depreciated as a result of child marriage. Human rights are violated as well as girls are deprived of future prospects because of child marriage. Child marriage is occurring due to ignorance of these consequences.
- **Lack of awareness on birth and marriage registration:** Still people of Bangladesh have lack of awareness about Birth and Death Registration Act 2004, Muslim Marriages and Divorces (Registration) Act 1974 and Hindu Marriage Registration Act 2012. For that reason, most of the marriage are arranged prior reaching legal age of marriage without registration.
- **Lack of implementation of child marriage restraint act:** Child marriage occurred in the society due to lack of proper implementation of Child Marriage Restraint Act.
- **Influence of dowry in marriage:** According to the traditional idea of the society, dowry is one of the most important reasons of child marriage in respect of the determination of marriage age.
- **Local match-makers impact on guardians:** Sometimes local match-makers influence on the guardians. So, without considering the future of girl child, the parents arrange marriage at an early age.

1.3. Consequences of child marriage

- **Risk of reproductive health and its impact:** Child marriage has a risk of reproductive health which is related to the debilitate health of mother and child.⁴ Consequently, 15 and 19 years old adolescent mother is double vulnerable to death because of their impregnation and child pregnancy complication rather than 20 and 24 years old mother.⁵ Besides, 15-19 years old adolescent mothers are in the high risk of uterine cancer, fistula and sexually transmitted disease.⁶ Under the 15 years old girls are in high risk and these aged mothers are in five times more death risk because of maternity. Children of adolescent mothers are also in severe health risk. These children of mothers have inadequate weight in their birth time, the baby is born before maturity and child death rate is quite high than matured mothers.⁷
- **Gender based violence:** According to UNFPA, girls who are married under 18 years old, are three times more victims of violence rather than 20 years old or above married girls. International report which is published by UNICEF about violence against children where among 15 to 19 years old married girls are faced physical, sexual or mental abuse by their husbands and this percentage is 47%.⁸
- **Mental health:** Child marriage depreciates the mental health of adolescent girls. As a result of child marriage, they do not psychologically prepare for taking any family as well as child bearing responsibility. Consequently, they have faced various psychological problems such as: depression, tension, unnecessary scare, cleanliness, suicide ideation etc.
- **Negative impact in respect of economic empowerment:** Child marriage hampers economic, physical and social development of girl child which deters their empowerment as well as participation in taking any decision. Consequently, their economic insolvency is increased and sustainable development as well as economic growth is affected.
- **Polygamy and divorce:** Child marriage, polygamy and divorce are increased as a result of child marriage.
- **Higher rates of population:** As a result of child marriage, girl becomes a mother of more children that increases the population.

2. Perspective of Preventing Child Marriage

2.1 Constitutional and Legal Framework

Comprehensive policies and legal framework plays a vital role to achieve the expected result of preventing child marriage. Considering the international standard of legal framework of child marriage the formulation of laws and policies are mentioned below:

2.1.1 International Commitments and Declarations to End Child Marriage

Bangladesh has already signed the international laws, declarations and policies related to child marriage and government of Bangladesh committed to proper implementation of Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the International Convention of Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR) and the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights (ICESCR), the Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW),⁹ the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC), the Convention on Consent to Marriage, Minimum Age for Marriage, and Registration of Marriages.¹⁰

(a) Universal Declaration of Human Rights 1948

- The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR) has set out fundamental human rights to be universally by the United Nations General Assembly on 1948. Therein, independent consent of marriage is recognized as right.
- Men and women of full age, without any limitation due to race, nationality or religion, have the right to marry and to found a family. They are entitled to equal rights as to marriage, during marriage and at its dissolution (Article 16.1).
- Marriage shall be entered into only with the free and full consent of the intending spouses (Article 16.2).

(b) Convention on the Consent to Marriage, Minimum Age for Marriage and Registration of Marriage 1964

It upholds the principle of full and free consent to marriage and such consent should be expressed by the intending spouses in person before the competent authority. The Convention evokes States Parties to take legislative action to specify a minimum age for marriage and no marriage shall be legally entered into by any person under the specified age, except where a competent authority has granted a dispensation as to age, for serious reasons, in the interest of the intending spouses as well as a call for all marriages to be registered in an appropriate official registers by the competent authority.

(c) Convention on the Elimination of all Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) 1979

- It is comprehensive international treaty guaranteeing the basic human rights for women. It provides the assurance of gender equality and elimination of all forms

of discrimination against women. It has given importance on the mutual compromise among the countries to keep the rights of women.

- States Parties shall take all appropriate measures to eliminate discrimination against women in all matters relating to marriage and family relations and in particular shall ensure, on a basis of equality of men and women: (a) The same right to enter into marriage; (b) The same right freely to choose a spouse and to enter into marriage only with their free and full consent; (c) The same rights and responsibilities during marriage and at its dissolution (Article 16.1).
- The betrothal and the marriage of a child shall have no legal effect, and all necessary action, including legislation, shall be taken to specify a minimum age for marriage and to make the registration of marriages in an official registry compulsory (16.2).

(d) Convention on the Rights of the Child 1989

- A child means every human being below the age of eighteen years unless under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier (Article 1).
- States Parties shall assure to the child who is capable of forming his or her own views the right to express those views freely in all matters affecting the child, the views of the child being given due weight in accordance with the age and maturity of the child (Article 12.1). States Parties shall take all appropriate legislative, administrative, social and educational measures to protect the child from all forms of physical or mental violence, injury or abuse, neglect or negligent treatment, maltreatment or exploitation, including sexual abuse, while in the care of parent(s), legal guardian(s) or any other person who has the care of the child (Article 19.1).

(e) International Conference on Population and Development 1994

- International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) Programme of Action (PoA) is a milestone of gender and health development. This action is considered as baseline of female reproductive health rights and development. In this case gender equality consider as influential driver of poverty, property distribution, violence, environment and health of women and adolescents which play an important role to change the attitude on female sexual and reproductive health and the reproductive health rights.
- In the year 2014, the member countries of united nations as well as Bangladesh declare again that ICPD-PoA is a solved agenda almost all the countries of world yet. The member countries again committed to move forward the programme of action.

(f) Kathmandu Call for Action to End Child Marriage in South Asia 2014

The main objective of the conference is to achieve the joint goals and shared visions that children throughout South Asia enjoy their right to harmonious development and be protected from all forms of discrimination, inequality, violence, abuse, exploitation, negligence, and threats to their reproductive and sexual health who are married off before 18 years of age.

(g) Sustainable Development Goals (2015-2030)

Bangladesh is committed to achieve Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) after Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) and formed an inter-ministerial committee to implement and monitoring the progress of the goals. Besides, private organizations have included to develop a platform for considering their importance. It is remarkable that among the 17 goals the goal 5 is directly focuses on the discrimination against women, child marriage, women's empowerment etc. Goals 1,2,3,4,8,11 and 16 have also highlighted the discrimination against women.

2.1.2 Acts, Rules and Plans for Preventing Child Marriage

Bangladesh is committed to establish the rights and overall development of children. To make a child friendly society Government has modified, formulated, approved, implemented some policies and plans of action. Government and development partners have jointly taken several activities to prevent child marriage besides national action plan and the policy.

(a) The Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh

The Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh has ensured and emphasized the fundamental rights of the citizen as well as the children. Some articles of the constitution have clearly mentioned about emancipation of the people from all forms of exploitation (Article 14), extending free and compulsory education to all children (Article 17), raising of the level of nutrition and the improvement of public health and increase the morality (Article 18) and positive activities for children and equality of opportunity for all citizens (Article 29).

(b) Muslim Marriages and Divorces (Registration) Act 1974

- Notwithstanding anything contained in any law, custom or usage, every marriage solemnized under Muslim law shall be registered in accordance with the provisions of this Act (section 3).
- Where a marriage is solemnized by a person other than the Nikah Registrar, the bridegroom of the marriage shall report it to the concerned Nikah Registrar within thirty days from the date of such solemnization (section 5.2).
- Where solemnization of a marriage is reported to a Nikah Registrar under sub-section (2), he shall register the marriage at once (section 5.3).
- A person who contravenes any provision of this section commits an offence and he shall be liable to be punished with simple imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine which may extend to three thousand taka, or with both (section 5.4).

(c) Dowry Prohibition Act 2018

- If any person, directly or indirectly, demands dowry from any party of marriage, then this will be a crime under this act, he shall be punishable with imprisonment which may be extend to [five years and shall not be less than one year, or with fine less than 50,000 (fifty thousand) taka or with both] (section 3).
- If any person gives or takes or abets or contracts the giving or taking of dowry, then this will be a crime under this act, he shall be punishable with imprisonment which may be extend to [five years and shall not be less than one year, or with fine less than 50,000 (fifty thousand) taka or with both] (section 4).

(d) Birth and Death Registration Act 2004

- The father or mother or guardian or the prescribed persons shall be liable to provide information related to birth of child to the Registrar within 45 (forty five) days of the child's birth (section 8.1).
- The birth or death certificate issued under this Act shall be deemed to be one of the primary evidences of age, birth or death related information of a person to any office or court or school-college, government and non-government organization (section 18.1).

- Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, the birth or death certificate shall be used to prove the age of a person in the following cases:- (a) Issuance of passport; (b) Registration of marriage; (c) Admission into educational institutions (section 18.3).
- If any person or registrar breach the articles under this Act or any rule made there under this Act, shall be punished with a fine up to Taka 500.00 (five hundred) or 2 months imprisonment or both (section 21).

(e) National Human Rights Commission Act 2009

To inquire, suo moto or on a petition presented by the person affected or any person on his behalf, into any allegation of violation of human rights or abetment thereof or negligence in resisting violation of human rights by a public servant (section 12.b).

(f) Hindu Marriage Registration Act 2012

Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law, traditions and customs, Hindu marriages, for the purpose of protecting the documentary evidence of Hindu marriage, can be registered in the manner prescribed by rules (section 3.1).

(g) Children Act 2013

The Children Act 2013 is aligned with the UNCRC and replaced the Children Act 1974. This Act has increased the age of the child from 16 to 18 years. Main sections of this Act are: the protection of child victim and children in conflict with the law, formation of a Child Welfare Board and designation of child affairs police officers in all police stations and the formation of a juvenile court in all districts.

(h) Child Marriage Restraint Act 2017

The Act is compulsory for respective person to restraint child marriage. According to the section no 2.4 of Child Marriage Restraint Act 2017 (Act no 06 and year of 2017), “Child marriage” means a marriage to which either of the contracting parties is a child. According to the section no 2.1 “minor” means a person who, if a male, is under twenty-one years of age, and if a female, is under eighteen years of age.

(i) Executive Order of Ministry of Women and Children Affairs to Prevent Child Marriage.

Despite the existing provisions or laws that legally forbade the child marriage but the existing prevalence of it in practice and a writ petition (No. 4781/2012) has been filed in the High Court Division on 20 June of 2012. According to the verdict of the High Court, Ministry of Women and Children Affairs has given an executive order to verify the birth certificate and national identity card during registering the marriage/nikah of Muslim women and men towards ending child marriage.

(j) National Children Policy 2011

The following steps shall be taken to eliminate the existing discrimination between boy and girl child in the socio-economic perspective:

- Necessary rights of the female children shall be ensured for proper development of their physical and mental health (8.1).

- Regular attendance of the girl child in educational institutions shall be ensured (8.3).
- Necessary arrangement shall be ensured so that the girl child does not victimize of any sexual harassment, pornography and physical and mental abuses in various situations such as in the streets including inside educational institutions (8.4).

(k) National Women Development Policy 2011

National Women Development Policy provides importance on the following subjects:

- Stern enforcement of legislations against minor matrimony, rape of female child, abuse and repression and trafficking (18.1).
- To make discrimination free treatment and put special emphases in meeting demands of female children such as, food, nutrition, health, education, sports and culture and vocational training (18.2).
- Ensuring necessary rights to the proper physical and mental growth of the girl child (18.3).
- Elimination of all forms of discriminatory treatment and ensuring gender equality in all areas including family (18.4).
- Ensuring regular attendance of the girl child in educational institutions (18.5).
- Ensuring necessary measures against girl child suffer no sexual harassment, pornography, physical and mental abuse in different situations such as educational institutions and in the streets (18.6).
- Ensuring facilities to the girl child for their safe and quality excursion and recreation, sports and cultural practices (18.7).
- Eliminating discriminatory treatment to disabled girl child and their security in all areas (18.8).

(l) National Action Plan for the Implementation of the National Women Development Policy 2011¹¹

Course to locate vulnerable area of child marriage and campaign for increasing the community and the school-based awareness against child marriage. Develop and update a database on violence against children, child marriage, child trafficking etc. As well as integration of other databases of government (18.1).

(m) National Action Plan to Prevent Violence Against Women and Children (2018-2030)¹²

- To set up child marriage prevention Bill Board at union level.
- Awareness campaign with guardian meeting on sexual harassment, child marriage, drug, dowry, illegal fatwa and trafficking.
- Mass awareness on child marriage and dowry.

2.2 Initiatives for the Prevention of the Child Marriage

- **Girl's Summit 2014:** London Girl's Summit 2014 was held on 22 July 2014 with the aims to draw attention to the priority led commitments. Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina pledged to end the child marriage of girls below the age of 15 years and to reduce by one-third the rate of marriage for girls aged between 15 and 18 years in 2021 and to completely eliminate child marriage by 2041.
- **Bangladesh Girl's Summit 2014:** After London Girl's Summit, Bangladesh Girl's Summit was held on 27 October 2014, organized jointly by the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs and BRAC¹³. The main objective of the summit is to take effective measure for women's empowerment through elimination of child marriage.
- **Child Marriage Prevention Day, September 29:** Government of Bangladesh observes the Child Marriage Prevention Day from 2014 by the approval of Prime Minister. Child Marriage Prevention day is observed every year at specific day of Child rights week. Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, NGOs, development partners and other organizations collectively celebrate the day by organizing different programmes like meeting, seminar, workshop, human chain, rally etc.
- **Education scholarship for school girls:** To increase the participation of girl students for socio-economic empowerment of women, Bangladesh government has different types of activities like girl's scholarship, pay waiver benefit, free books distribution. Moreover, quantity and number of general meritorious scholarship and vocational education scholarship have remarkably increased for the scholar girl students.
- **Governance Innovation Unit:** Governance Innovation Unit of Prime Minister Office takes different initiatives to determine the issue of child marriage and arranges different types of training like database for the Marriage Register, District Register, Deputy Director of Islamic Foundation, Deputy Director of Women Affairs and other respective officers.
- **National Helpline Centre for Violence Against Women and Children (109):** Helpline Centre for Violence Against Women and Children (National Toll Free Helpline 109) plays a vital role to stop and prevent child marriage. Helpline Service Provider collects detail information from the caller like name of the candidate, father's and mother's name, detail address, address and phone number of the school, place of marriage, date of birth, age, date of marriage etc. After getting the information the Helpline Service Provider informed the child marriage information to District Administration, Upazila Nirbahi Officer, District and Upazila Women Affairs Officer, Officer In-charge of Police Station, Chairman of Upzila and Union, Headmaster, respective ward member, civil society, One Stop Crisis Cell and other responsible person and requested to take initiative to stop the child marriage. After that the Helpline Service Provider follow-up the case.

- **Adolescent Clubs:** Department of Women Affairs provide different types of life skill training among the adolescent through the adolescent club like child marriage, sexual harassment, dowry, child rights, income generating activities etc. The members of club assembled twice a time in a week and discusses various social issues such as child marriage, dowry, violence against women and children, trafficking, drop-out from school etc. Besides, adolescents are declared not to do child marriage as well as prevent the child marriage. Currently, 4883 adolescent clubs have been established in Union and Pourashava level.
- **Girls Not Bride Bangladesh Alliance:** This alliance has been formed with 26 organizations such as: BRAC, BLAST, Care Bangladesh, Family Planning Association Bangladesh (FPAB), Plan International Bangladesh, Population Council, ICDDR, B, Marie Stopes Bangladesh, World Vision. The aims of the alliance are to using the personal experience in a platform to advocacy for empowerment of girl child and end child marriage.
- **LCG WAGE Platform:** Local consultative group on women and gender equality (LCGWAGE) is a platform of development partners and UN system in Bangladesh and works collectively with the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs to end child marriage.

3. National Action Plan to End Child Marriage (2018-2030)

3.1 Main Principles of National Action Plan

- Ensure Child Rights in light of the Constitution of Bangladesh, Children Act, and International Charters.
- State shall not discriminate against any citizen on grounds only of religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth.
- Nothing in this article shall prevent the State from making special provision in favor of women or children or for the advancement of any backward section of citizens.
- Protection of the best interest of the child and to ensure the children's opinion as well as their participation in all stages of development.
- Ensure the best of the children and the adolescent through providing necessary standard services.
- Ensure the participation of the local government institutions and local communities to end child marriage.
- Ensure the participation of government agencies, non-government organizations, development partners and civil societies for preventing child marriage.

3.2 Goals and Objectives of National Action Plan

Goal:

To end the marriage of girls below the age of 15 years and to reduce by one-third the rate of marriage for girls aged between 15 and 18 years by 2021 and to completely eliminate child marriage by 2041.

Objectives:

To eliminate the child marriage through the existing institutional initiatives, ongoing programmes and comprehensive efforts of all within the specific time frame.

Specific Objectives:

- Increase the scope for all girls to fully realize their rights and have access to quality education, health and reproductive rights, nutrition, protection and safe water and sanitation facilities.
- Formulate and amend the laws and rules to eliminate child marriage and increase awareness of legal structure and legal remedies for girls whose rights are violated for child marriage.
- Enhance awareness on the harmful consequences of child marriage and gender-based violence to change social stereotyped mindset through community mobilization.
- Empowerment of girl adolescents, increase their participation, acquire life skills, ensure modern facilities and decision making in family and community.
- Scale up the existing and future social safety-net programmes to eliminate child marriage.

4. Implementation Strategies

Strategy 1: Take action to implement sector specific policies as per demand and necessity of children and adolescents.

Getting repletion of education, health and security rights of all children regardless of girl and boy is the significant achievement in the field of meaningful participation in their personal living progress, security and decision making. Social protection impact on long-term children's development which is existing from childhood to adolescent period. For this reason, it is important to adopt the implementation programme where sectoral policy is based on adolescents.

- **Implementation Strategy-1:** Formulation, implementation, coordination and evaluation of sector specific policies (education, health, nutrition, industry, agriculture, environment, disaster management etc.) in line with the adolescent girls and boys.
- **Implementation Strategy-2:** Initiative to increase social security for children and adolescents.
- **Implementation Strategy-3:** Access to justice and ensure protection services for victims whose rights are violated for child marriage.

Strategy 2: Ensure amendment and implementation of laws, proper formulation of policies and accountability.

Although existing minimum age determined by the law as well as government system of marriage and birth registration, but the lack of awareness of guardian and other exceptional rules debilitate the effectiveness of law protection.

- **Implementation Strategy-1:** Strengthen birth and marriage registration system.
- **Implementation Strategy-2:** Proper implementation of laws to prevent child marriage and protect married girls from violence.
- **Implementation Strategy-3:** Ensure awareness and mutual coordination about acts and policies.

Strategy 3: Develop positive social values and norms through influencing, supporting and engaging families, communities and policymakers for preventing child marriage.

Extended network is used with success in Bangladesh as well as the information exchange for encouraging and influencing the people for adopting the programmes of sustainable development. Currently, Bangladesh has faced some obstructions (such as: using the free toilet, using safe water, extended vaccination programme, poverty eradication), similar to these proper time communication programme will be played the main role to end child marriage. Detrimental consequences of child marriage will be dealt with multi-dimensional strategy and action plan. Core tool of national action plan implementation is the successful communication programme application for the development in ending child marriage.

- **Implementation Strategy-1:** Increase community engagement for changing social norms and behavior.
- **Implementation Strategy-2:** Increase engagement of local government institutions in the prevention of child marriage.
- **Implementation Strategy-3:** Provide skill development training to local government, community, adolescents, guardians, policymakers and strengthen monitoring system.

Strategy 4: Ensure empowerment of adolescent girls and boys as an agent of social change.

As per negative norms/attitudes, social values, gender, age and social position & status, society sustains the discriminatory relations which hamper the development of the girl child. Family and society will be jointly formulated policy and strategy for child development. Adolescent period is a development phase of human life cycle from where they are able to ask a question and challenge to the traditional social customs and norms. So, these matters bear importance in respect of programme formulation for their empowerment. The change will come in such a kind in our society as a result of the formulated programme where girl and women will be empowered and their rights will be ensured for the empowerment of adolescents.

- **Implementation Strategy-1:** Ensure the empowerment of adolescent girls and boys through life-skill training, access to knowledge and information.
- **Implementation Strategy-2:** Ensuring the participation of adolescent girls and boys in decision making process.

Strategy 5: Promote the digitalization of education, legal, reproductive health facilities of adolescents as well as social protection system of children and ensure appropriate incentives for adolescent girls.

It has been already proved that the different positive effects of social safety net and social protection in respect of eradicating poverty and reducing discrimination through augmenting the presence rate in school, prevent the

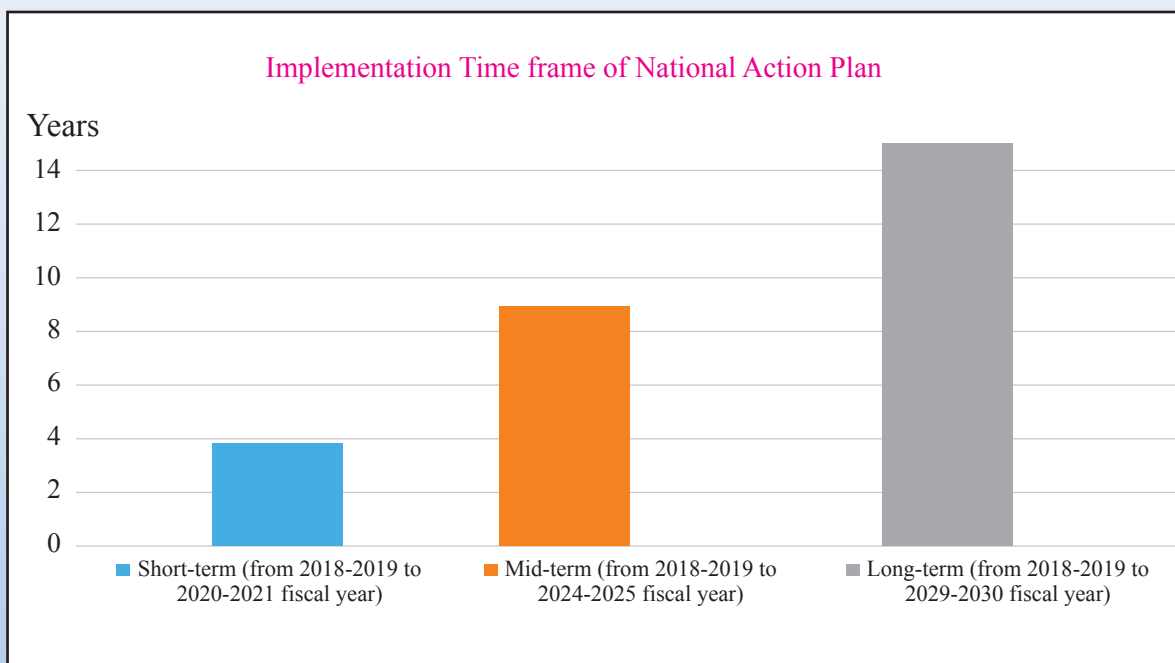
drop-out rate and the participation in the education programme. In respect of existing impact of these programmes on child development, the sound health of the child and gradual increasing of sound health in beneficiary regions.

- **Implementation Strategy-1:** Social safety-net and protection programmes for impoverished families.
- **Implementation Strategy-2:** Access to education and future employment opportunities through economic empowerment of adolescent girls.

5. Implementation Time Frame of National Action Plan

The fiscal year 2018-2019 is considered as base year of the National Action Plan to End Child Marriage with the context of Sustainable Development Goals by United Nations in 2015. This action plan will be implemented in three phases on the basis of vision 2021 and 2041 declared by the Hon'ble Prime Minister.

- Short-term (2018-2019 to 2020-2021 fiscal year)
- Mid-term (2018-2019 to 2024-2025 fiscal year)
- Long-term (2018-2019 to 2029-2030 fiscal year)



6. Monitoring and Evaluation of Action Plan

A comprehensive monitoring and evaluation framework has been included in this plan to ensure its implementation and to achieve the results and accountability to prevent child marriage. On the basis of the monitoring and evaluation framework, the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, other implementing ministries, NGOs, development partners and donors will be able to monitor the implementation status of the plan.

On the basis of the proposed strategy and desired programme, the concerned authority will identify the indicators, baseline and targets of the Plan; collect information through the related ministries and agencies, explain the analysis and information management activities, provide the reporting deadline, guidelines and obligations and take the initiative to use and publish information obtained through the monitoring and evaluation process.

Monitoring includes the follow-up of the implementation status of the specific objectives in the disciplined manner. On the other hand, evaluation is a method by which any other catalyst has influenced on the plan or policy or whether the action taken in achieving the final goal is correct.

7. Funding for Implementation of Action Plan

In order to ensure proper implementation of the National Action Plan, it is necessary to consider the allocation of specific budget for the 7th Five Year Plan. For the prevention of child marriage, the ministry will monitor the resource mobilization and results by measuring the progress of implementation of proposed strategies and programmes of the proposed budget and budgetary indicators. Concerned ministries will take initiatives to enhance the technical skills of the focal points.

8. Ministries and Organizations for Coordinating Action Plan

Strong commitment, all time supervision, involvement and implementation will enhance the progress of the government to end child marriage. Integrated and consolidated national action plan will be possible to reduce child marriage and reduce its harmful effects by using the available support, resources, skills and necessary budgets through expansion programmes. The national action plan will be implemented, monitored and coordinated successfully under the leadership of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs.

8.1. Guidelines for Action Plan Implementation

A National Child Marriage Prevention Committee is formed under the leadership of Hon'ble State Minister of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs, according to the Child Marriage Restraint Act 2017 and Rules 2018 that include Women Member of Parliament, Gender Focal Person of respective ministries and departments, NGOs and development partners.

The key responsibility of the committee is to provide proper guidance on identifying and resolving the challenges of child marriage. Besides, committee will undertake special measures aimed at promoting child marriages and to create social awareness through local magazines, cable networks, billboards, posters, leaflets, documentaries, workshops, seminars, symposiums and social networking, including folklore, print and electronic media.

8.2. Implementation Mechanism

National Action Plan to End Child Marriage will be implemented by the coordination of division, district and upazila administration and local government institutions

under the leadership of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs. During the implementation of the planning, there has been included different government agencies, NGOs, INGOs, development partners, policymakers of local level and different organizations of United Nations, civil society and religious leaders as well as adolescents.

All important issues and matters regarding the child marriage prevention have been mentioned in this guideline. So, it will be possible to implement the national action plan through its effective application. Respective partners on the basis of the mentioned programmes of the action plan will be able to work for the prevention of child marriage.

Concerned departments of the government and non-government organizations are working on the prevention of child marriage will be able to adopt their own programmes as per the objectives, strategies and matrix of the national action plan. In case of the implementation process, it is important to consider its principles and national and international laws, policies and charters.

9. Participation and Role of National and International Organizations

Elimination of child marriage is a comprehensive multi-dimensional effort. Child marriage is related to the socio-economic condition, poverty, implementation of the law, availability of the services and social awareness . There are different programmes implementing by the national and international organizations and civil societies to end child marriage. It is necessary to coordinate the described activities of the national action plan with these programmes. A joint platform will be formed for the mutual cooperation and the concerted programmes under the leadership of the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs. Everyone is responsible for achieving the targets through the monitoring and evaluation of the National Action Plan.

10. Action Plan Implementation Strategy and Matrix:

Strategy 1: Take action to implement sector specific policies as per demand and necessity of children and adolescents.

- **Implementation Strategy-1:** Formulation, implementation, coordination and evaluation of sector specific policies (education, health, nutrition, industry, agriculture, environment, disaster management etc.) in line with the adolescent girls and boys.
